SUMMARY

The Bedford County Sheriff's Office has prepared a Body-Worn Camera Grant to be submitted to the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services. This is a competitive grant for law enforcement agencies to implement or expand a Body-Worn program to further enhance problem solving and officer interactions with the public to build community trust. The Sheriff's office wishes to use the grant to purchase 10 body-worn cameras at a cost of \$10,267.50. The Sheriff's Office will be required to provide a 50% cash match of \$3,422.50 which is included in the Sheriff's proposed budget for FY 2021-2022. Grant funds will be awarded for a 12 month period beginning on April 1, 2020. The grant application has been submitted to meet the January 29, 2021 deadline. The Sheriff, Mike Miller, is requesting that the Board of Supervisors authorize the submission of the grant application for \$6,845 and a \$3,422.50 match to the Virginia Department of Justice Services. If funds are awarded, the Sheriff also requests that the awarded funds be accepted and appropriated.

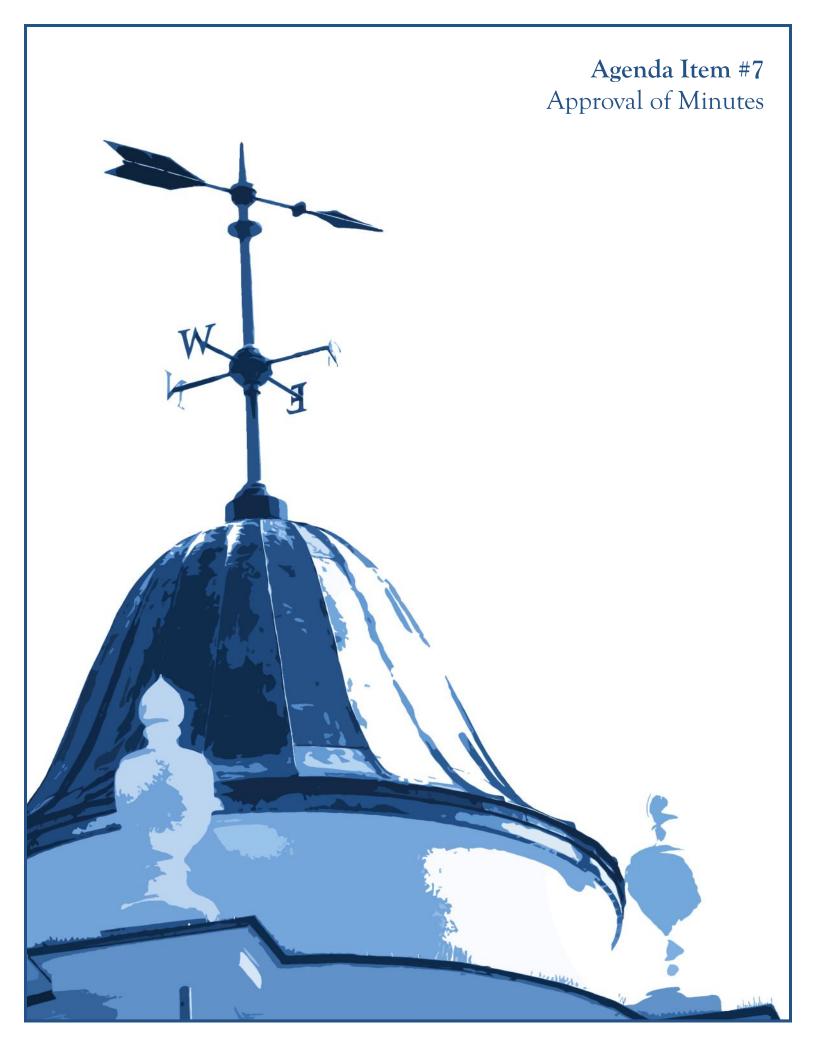

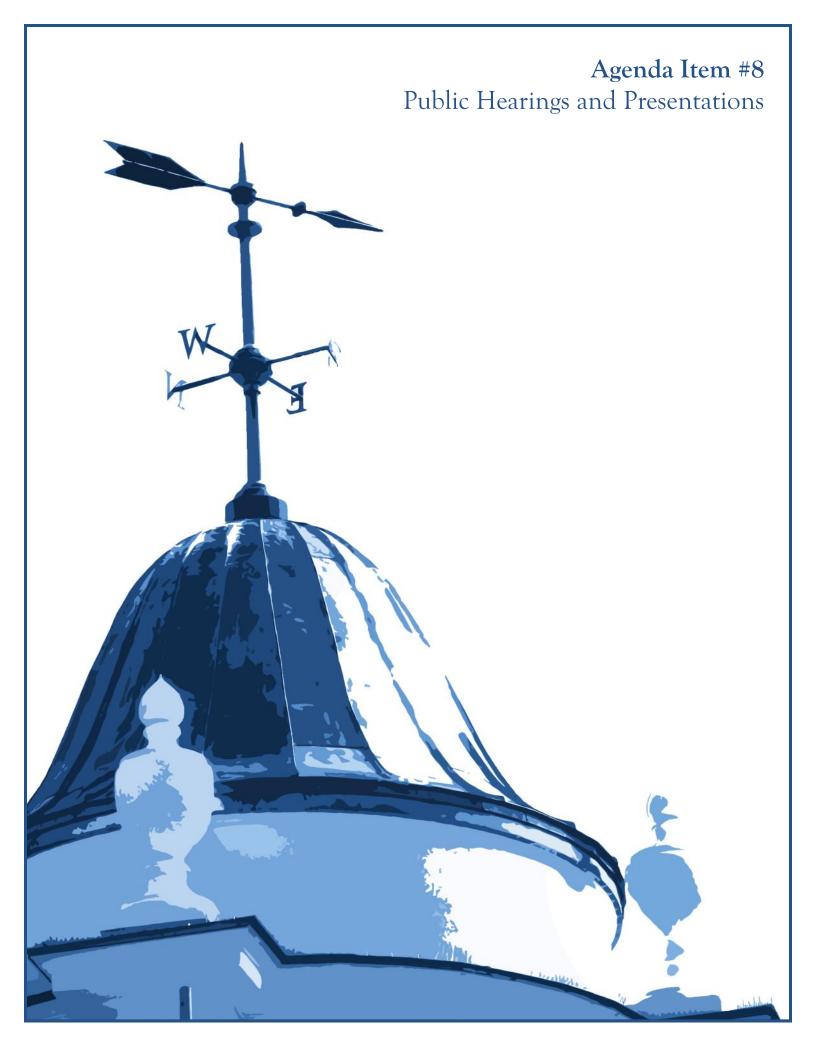

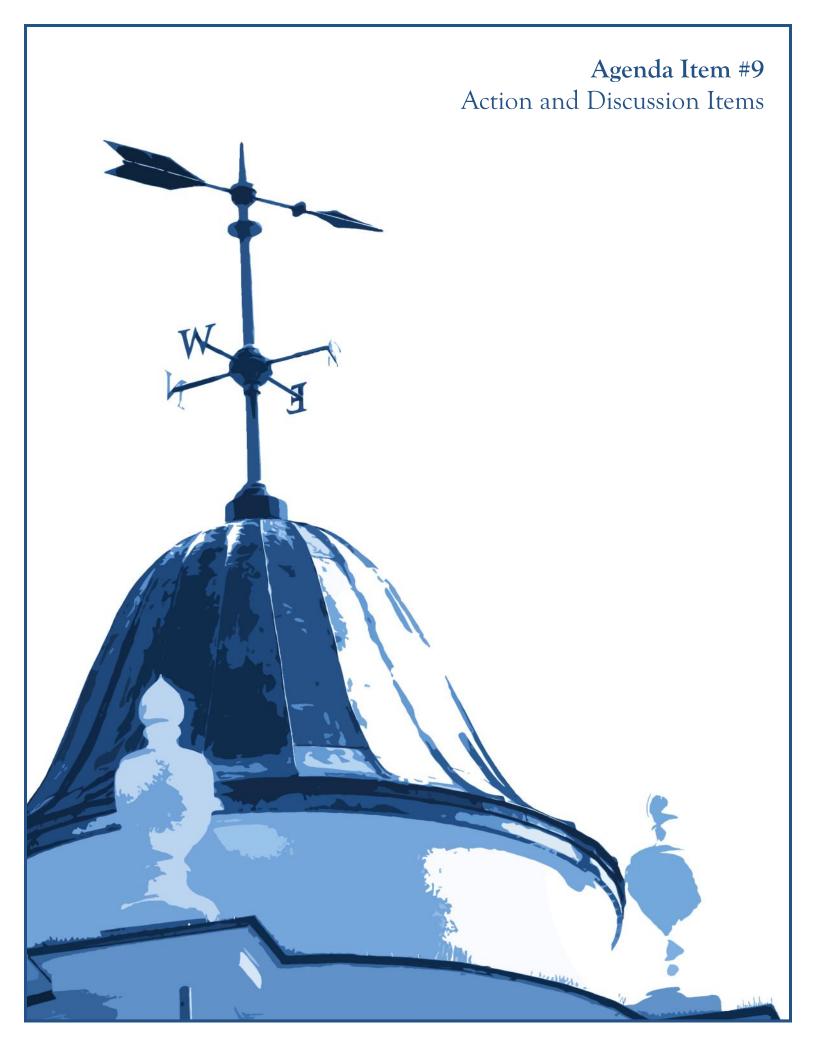

RECOMMENDATION Authorize the execution of contracts for on call architectural and engineering services.			
SUMMARY			
The Board authorized staff to issue a Request for Proposals for on-call Architectural and Engineering services on September 28 th . In response to this advertisement 13 responses were received. The County requires assistance from architecture and engineering firms on occasions. This assistance often requires the development of detailed drawing and studies for items such as: architectural design, civil, mechanical, electrical, plumbing, structural, and various other specialties. These on call services are critical for the timely response to needs at County facilities. The County's existing contract has recently expired. Proposals were reviewed and the selection committee (with representation from Public Works and Parks & Rec) scheduled interviews with the highest ranked firms.			
The selection committee is recommending that on call contracts be established with multiple firms to allow greater flexibility for the County. The following firms are recommended for on call contracts:			
-Master Engineers and Designers (Lynchburg VA) -Spectrum Design (Roanoke VA) -Virginia A&E (Forest VA) -Wiley Wilson (Lynchburg VA)			

PRIOR ACTIONS

The Board authorized the issuance of a Request for Proposals on September 28th.

Code allows annual contracts renewable up to 5 years.

RECOMMENDATION

ZiTEL reached full completion of this project in January 2021 and staff recommends approval of this resolution to accept the project and release final retainage.

SUMMARY

The purpose of Phase II of the Bedford County Internet Initiative was to continue addressing internet coverage gaps in our community. An RFP was issued on August 21, 2020 and held open until September 14, 2020. The proposal submitted by ZiTEL was supported by the RFP review committee and a contract was approved by the Board of Supervisors on October 26, 2020.

ZiTEL installed 48.1 miles of fiber at four different sites throughout the county. The four sites are Big Island, Diamond Hill, Cedar Key, and Staunton River. The fiber installed is estimated to accommodate 1,820 households with fiber internet connections.

Bedford County was awarded \$564,500 in grant dollars through State CARES funds, to be used toward the Diamond Hill and Staunton River portions of ZiTEL's project.

October 26, 2020: Resolution approving a network services agreement with ZiTEL, LLC. for the expansion of broadband internet as part of phase II of the Bedford County Internet Iniative in the amount of \$1,234,500.

Resolution directing the County Administrator to Accept and Appropriate Funds from the State of Virginia for Fast-Track Broadband Projects, if awarded.

FISCAL IMPACT

The remaining retainage associated with this project is \$61,725. The total contract amount was for \$1,234,500.

Subject: RE: Cedar Key

Yes sorry it's been one crazy week.

The fiber that is still visible in Cedar key is part of the drop layer. There are 3 overall layers in a fiber to the home build. The Feeder layer is the "backbone", it connects the core of the network. It's the highest count fiber and usually only run on main roads or paths. It connects your Central Office to your Point of Presence buildings. This is composes about 80% of what ZiTEL was awarded for the cares act funds. The next layer would be the Distribution layer. It is your branches or lateral builds, the side roads off of the backbone; ruffly the last 20%. These go down side roads and into subdivisions etc. Then finally there is your Drop layer. The actual fiber from a splice point to the house; we did not include any budget or build on this layer to be funded from cares funding. We consider this our cost and are modeled into our business model. We are also using a Distributed Split model with fiber reuse. What that means is we have splitters our in the field at certain splice points instead of every drop being from back to a LCP cabinet; aka "home run". It is a more cost efficient build topology but with the fiber reuse it some times inter mingles are Distribution Layer and our Drop layers. We design it to use the same fiber part of the way for Distribution to the splitter, then it converts and turns into a Drop layer or cable going to the house.

I know that's a lot of technical jargon to absorb so an example would be:

From 122 down route 608 (White house) down 608 Tolers Ferry would all be considered Feeder / Backbone. This is actually the budget we submitted for the "Cedar Key" portion of the Cares Act. The reasoning was Cedar Key is all private roads.

From the turn on Cedars Key to each splice point / turn is all considered Distribution layers.

We are spliced into each of these Vaults with live light from our CO (Central Office). These have been tested and verified. We have one at Witcher Creek Ln and Gobbler Ridge Ln


What is laying on the ground is essentially a long Drop layer.

It is stretched out to reach the end of Bay Terrace, and will terminate at our splice vault at the intersection of Gobbler Ridge Ln and Cedar Key Ln. I received several calls from Cedar Key that involved an unordinary build with the houses being on one side of the road and the septic being under and on the other side of the road. We did not want to damage anyone's property so I personally setup and meet with James Erler the President of Cedar Key HoA on the 15th to walk the routes and give me a full explanation on what was what in the field. We have plats, and information from the Health Department and pending weather that drop will be installed to provide services to 112 and 109 Bay Terrace within our next 2 working days.
